
2025 Global Mobility Humanities Conference



Signing of an MOU with Banpo Library

The Academy of Mobility Humanities has signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the Banpo Library in Seochogu to establish a collaborative system for regional humanities education and to foster meaningful exchange and cooperation. The two institutions will mutually cooperate to promote and invigorate the humanities by utilising their content, knowledge resources, and infrastructure, as well as organising local humanities events, including humanities book concerts and humanities festivals.





Infrastructure Humanities Fair – Photo Contest

The Mobility Humanities Education Centre held a "Photo Contest" as part of the 2025 Infrastructure Humanities Fair, from July 14th (Mon) to July 31st (Thurs). Under the theme of "Environment and Infrastructure," including coexistence with nature, signs of climate change, a sustainable future, and a plastic-free life, ten works were selected as winners (1 Grand Prize, 2 Gold Prizes, 3 Silver Prizes, 4 Bronze Prizes).

Infrastructure Humanities Fair – Infrastructure Humanities Visiting

The Academy of Mobility Humanities Education Centre is hosting "Infrastructure Humanities Visiting" as part of the Infrastructure Humanities Fair. "Infrastructure Humanities Visiting" is a regional infrastructure cultural commentary tour programme designed to share



key agendas and contribute to local cultural vitalisation by exploring regional historical and cultural infrastructure.

This programme will be conducted over four sessions, held every Friday from September 19th to October 24th.

With commentary by Chanwoong Lim, a traditional culture instructor at the National Folk Museum of Korea, the tour will explore "Hanyang Infrastructure from Joseon to Enlightenment Period." The course includes Sijeon (the commercial infrastructure of Joseon), Hanyang Fortress streams, Tapgol Park (the first Western-style park in the city), and Daehan Hospital (modern medical infrastructure).


